The beginning of the history of basketball in Greece is inextricably linked with YMCA of Thessaloniki, since it is a historical fact that it was the one that brought it to our country and played a vital role in spreading and developing the sport.

Basketball was known in Thessaloniki, as early as 1919, and from the "Soldier's Houses" that the YMCA Military Mission established in order to animate and make the lives of the young army as pleasant as possible. At that time, the first demonstration games were held and the sport was first taught to the city by the foundation of the YMCA of Thessaloniki in 1921.

YMCA of Thessaloniki is the oldest club of our country, introducing the sport in Greece (1921), but at the same time it has been the pioneer in its propagation. For decades, the Association has hosted all the events in its facilities, has brought great personalities in the years to come, but even in modern times still produces great athletes.


