

SHORT PRESENTATION

The virtual biodiversity museum was created by the Municipality of Kresna as part of the VIRTUAL AND MOBILE MUSEUM OF BIODIVERSITY PROJECT to present the enormous variety of the wildlife in the Kresna Gorge and the Paggiao Mountain. It was designed to supplement the physical biodiversity museum in Kresna which was also created as part of this project.

The virtual museum is a tool which is intended to attract the attention of the younger audience to biodiversity protection by the means of contemporary digital instruments. Its purpose is to inform and inspire children, students and anyone interested to become acquainted with the animals of the cross-border region (birds, mammals, reptiles, etc.), as well as protected fauna and Natura 2000 habitats.
